Eligibility

The program is open to students, ages 14-21, with severe physical and developmental disabilities. Conditions may include, but are not limited to: Cerebral Palsy, Neuromuscular and related disabilities (Spina Bifida, Cognitive Impairment, Muscular Dystrophy), or feeding, speech and language problems.

If you are unsure if your child is eligible, please contact us.

Transportation

Transportation to and from the Summer Transition Program should be arranged for privately by the student's caregiver.

Note: Transportation will be provided by the Summer Transition Program for all of the program's community outings.
