Green Bay, Wisconsin - September 18, 2008. Former Green Bay Packer, Bill Curry, recently selected as Georgia State University's inaugural head football coach, will speak at Cerebral Palsy, Inc.'s (CP) Annual Celebration Dinner, Thursday, Oct. 9, at the Swan Club in De Pere. Dinner will be followed by Curry sharing riveting tales from his playing days, including time under the legendary Vince Lombardi, all told with his fiery, straight-from-the-heart passion; the evening will conclude with the 2008 "Where Caring Comes to Life" awards presentation. The annual awards are presented to businesses, service groups and community volunteers for their outstanding contributions, long-term support of the CP organization and devotion to persons with disabilities. Recipients of the awards will be announced at the event.

In June, Curry, who has spent his entire adult life as a leader and communicator, was named as head football coach of Georgia State University's new football program, and more recently his book, *Ten Men You Meet in the Huddle*, was released and praised as "the best book about the NFL." His career also includes two NFL Super Bowl titles; a stint as the President of the NFL Players Association; time as head football coach at Georgia Tech, the University of Alabama, and the University of Kentucky; and several years as a college football analyst for ESPN. In 1989, his leadership skills were recognized when he was awarded the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Award, and he received the 2007 Amos Alonzo Stagg Award in honor of his outstanding service toward the advancement of the best interests of football.
