Two Rivers, Wisconsin - February 22, 2008. Cerebral Palsy, Inc. (CP) is pleased to announce the launch of its first satellite site in Manitowoc County. The new facility, 2218 11th Street, Two Rivers, which opened in January, provides adult day programming to citizens, in Manitowoc County and surrounding areas, with physical disabilities. Julie Tetzlaff, Director of Adult Day Services for CP, said, "We are pleased to provide programming to the folks in this expanded area.

Some of the participants at our new facility were coming to our Green Bay location; their daily bus trips to Green Bay and back home could add up to three hours on any given day. This will give them the opportunity to spend more quality time in their own communities." Tetzlaff added, "That's what it is all about." The facility, which will employ five full-time employees, has plans to expand the array of service offerings at the site in the future.

The renovated building, formerly St. Mark's Catholic Church, includes an exercise area, computer lab, and kitchen where clients work on skill development. They focus on fine and gross motor development, self-care skills, and personal growth and development. Curriculum may include cooking, music, art, and computer classes.

The public is invited to a ribbon cutting ceremony and open house to celebrate the opening of the facility with clients and staff on Tuesday, April 15, 2008, at 2:00 p.m.
